JUSTIFICATION:

The Communications Center operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in the original work environment that was built in 2008. The implemented design for consoles consisted of a laminate kitchen countertop for a work surface. The constant use combined with the age of the countertop has left the work surface with patchwork repairs that are failing. The current design also does not protect the computers from dust which shortens their life span. One of the large costs to replacing these with dust free consoles as proposed is the cost of the labor for all the other affected areas such as the radio system and moving the 911/Dispatch to the EOC temporarily for installation. With the grant approved replacement of the radio system, these high labor costs would be covered and save the City considerable time and money.
