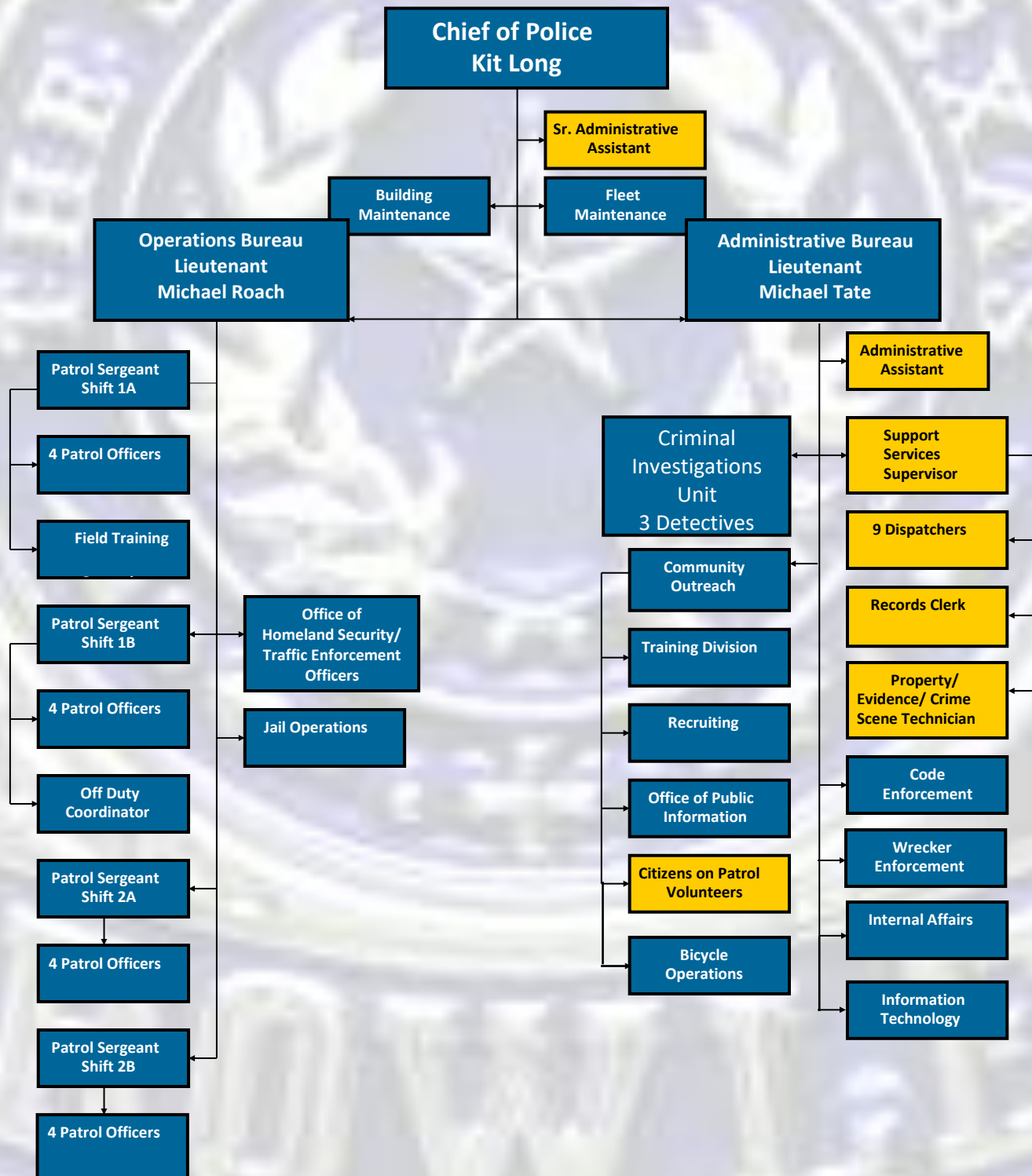

**Property and Evidence Storage Composition**



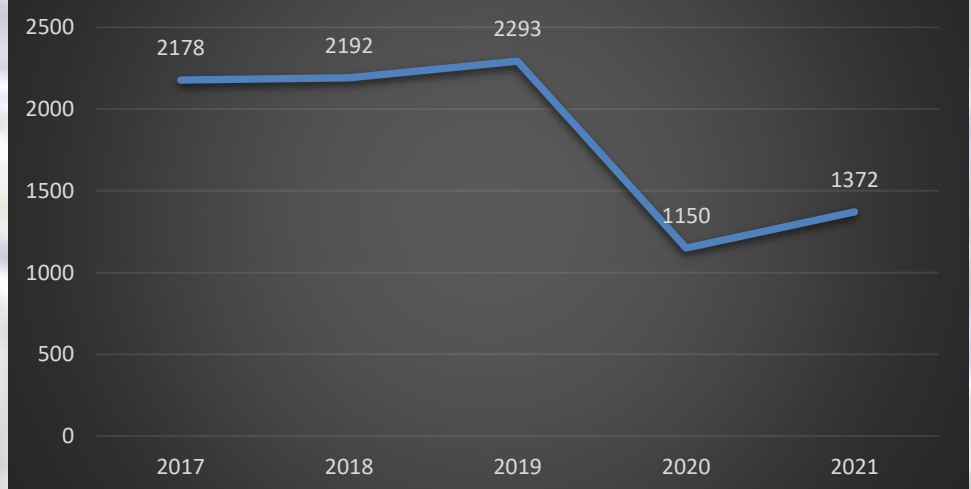

## Code Compliance

is in violation of: Sec. 34-59 Weeds and Grass

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person owning, claiming, occupying or having supervision or control of any real property, occupied or unoccupied, within the corporate limits of the city, to permit or allow any weeds, brush, vegetative growth and other objectionable or unsightly matter to grow to a greater height than 12 inches upon such real property to the property line and to a point 15 feet outside any such property line or to the curb that is adjacent to a street or alley right-of-way. All vegetation, not regularly cultivated, and which exceeds 12 inches in height, shall be presumed to be objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary, and is hereby declared a public nuisance.

(b) With respect to lots, tracts or parcels of land of five or more acres and under single ownership, a person, owner, tenant, agent or person responsible for such property commits an offense if such person allows weeds to grow to a greater height than 12 inches within an area 50 feet from any open public street or thoroughfare, as measured from the right-of-way line of such street or thoroughfare, and within an area 20 feet from any adjacent property under different ownership and on which any building is located or on which any improvement exists, as measured from the property line.

### Sec. 34-58 Stagnant Water

It shall be unlawful for any person owning, claiming, occupy in or having supervision or control of any real property, occupied or unoccupied, within the limits of the city, to permit or allow holes or places on such lot where water may accumulate and become stagnant, or permit such condition to remain. It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lot in the city to permit or allow the accumulation of stagnant water on such lot, or to permit such condition to remain.

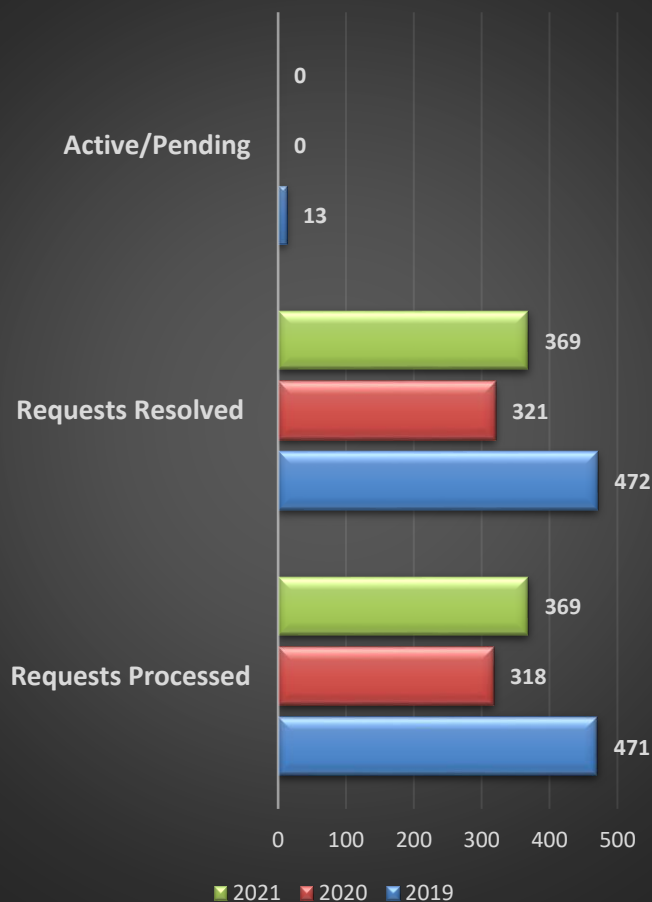
You are required to correct the violation(s) within ten (10) days of this notice posting. Failure to correct the violation(s) will result in the City of Crowley correcting the violation(s) and billing you for the charges incurred. Furthermore, failure to pay the charges will result in a lien being placed on your property, in accordance with Chapter 34 Environment of the Code of the City of Crowley, Texas. Please contact Code Compliance at (817)297-2276 if you have any questions.

This is the only notice you will receive to mow and or clean - up your property including any stagnant water for the next 12 months. Subsequent unclean premises, weeds and/or grass including stagnant water violations on this property, may result in the city WITHOUT FURTHER NOTICE, abating the violation(s) at the owner's expense.

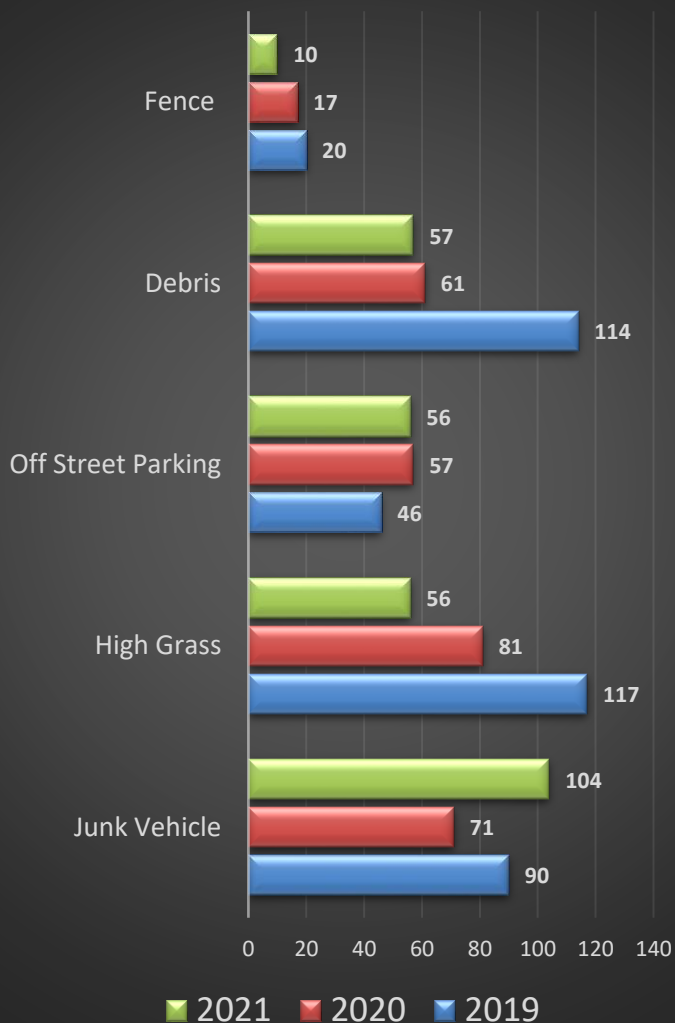

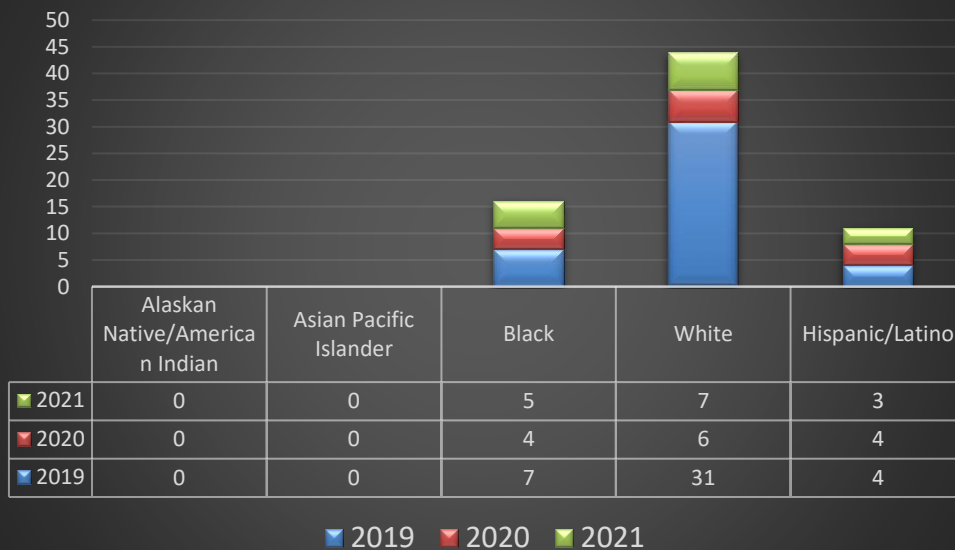

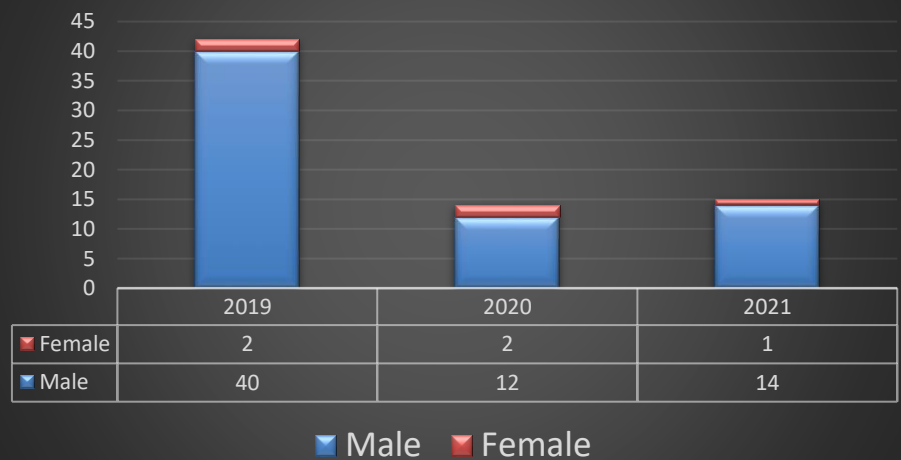
